Candles: A GLOWING Concern!

Voice Over Length: 30 seconds

Over the past few years, the use of candles in the home has greatly increased—and so has the number of fires caused by their misuse. Your fire department offers the following tips for the safe use of candles.

Secure your candle in a sturdy holder on a flat surface and, if possible, place a glass chimney or shade over it. Keep lit candles out of the reach of children and pets, and well away from any combustible materials. An unattended candle is an invitation to disaster, so don't forget to extinguish your candles before leaving the room or going to bed.

Remember to keep all matches and lighters out of the sight and reach of children. A message from the Fire Marshal's Public Fire Safety Council and this station.

Candle Safety CANDLE FIRES ARE ON THE RISE!

There's nothing cosier than the warm glow of candle light, but did you know that candles are one of the leading causes of fire? Your fire department asks you to please take care when using candles in your home.

Keep lit candles in sturdy holders on level surfaces and if possible, place a glass chimney or shade over it. Candles can easily be knocked over, so keep them out of the reach of children and pets, and away from anything that can burn. Be sure you snuff out candles before leaving the room or going to bed.

Holiday Fire Safety Have a Fire-Safe Holiday Season!

Voice Over Length: 30 seconds

Enjoy the holiday season but be cautious with your Christmas tree. Buy a freshly cut tree and keep the stand full of water at all times. Keep it away from all heat sources and make sure it doesn't block a doorway. Check all decorative lights before placing them on the tree and discard any frayed or damaged lights and cords. Never place lighted candles on or near the Christmas tree. When large amounts of needles begin to fall off, it's time to get rid of the tree.
